THOMAS BEEBY, FAIA Hammond Beeby Rupert Ainge, Inc.

Thomas Beeby is director of design for Hammond Beeby Rupert Ainge, Inc. As lead designer he directs the work of the design team through the design phase of each project, and continues to monitor the conformance of the project to its original design intent through review of design documents, material selection and detailing.

Beeby is a graduate and former dean of the Yale University School of Architecture, and continues as adjunct professor of Architectural Design. He has also served as director of the School of Architecture at the University of Illinois at Chicago and associate professor at the Illinois Institute of Technology. Mr. Beeby travels widely and has been lecturer or jury critic at several universities including Columbia University, Cornell University, Princeton University and Rice University.

and has served on a number of
AIA national committees and
juries. Six of Beeby's projects have
received AIA National Honor
Awards, while eighteen other
projects have received
Distinguished Building and Honor
Awards from the Chicago chapter.

Some of Beeby's current projects include a revitalization of urban Chicago townhomes and a new performing arts center near Lake Michigan. Aside from the Chicago area, his work is also found in a number of other states. Locally, Beeby contributed to the Hale Library renovation on the Kansas State University campus.



Eugene Mackey is chairman of MackeyMitchellAssociates, the firm he founded in 1968. The firm's work encompasses architecture, planning and interior design. Mackey is a graduate of Washington University, St. Louis, and also the Harvard Graduate School of Design. Mr. Mackey has served on numerous professional committees, including terms as a director of AIA St. Louis. Has served as president of the AIA St. Louis chapter and was invested into the AIA College of Fellows in 1991. Mr. Mackey has served as panelist for many design competitions, including the National Committee on Urban Planning & Design and the jury of the College of Fellows.

Mackey has a deep sense of commitment to the St. Louis community, a trait "inherited" from his father who was involved in the issues of St. Louis. He is an active leader of the community and has been recognized for his community commitment.

Hobbies of travel and sketching have led to several exhibits of Mackey's work.
