
TIMOTHY B. BLONKVIST, FAIA Overland Partners Architects

Timothy Blonkvist is a founding principal of Overland Partners Architects, with offices in San Antonio, Texas and Bozeman, Montana. The firm's creations embrace the visitor's experience through emotional and experiential architecture; they are also based on a series of values which drive each project and the evolution of their development.

Blonkvist's body of work shows a diversity of experiences, and now he devotes his efforts to projects relating to art, religion, research and education. His signature approach to architecture was developed as a senior designer with I.M. Pei & Associates in New York, where he worked with the expansion of the Louvre in Paris and the Bank of China in Hong Kong. 
C. ROBERT SCHMIDT
